
# Dalton Trumbo: The Life and Work of a Hollywood Icon



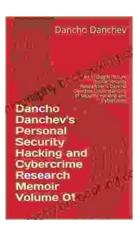
