Tableau Layout

The tableau consists of 10 piles of cards, with the top card of each pile face up. The remaining cards are hidden.

Reserve and Stock Piles

Be Patient

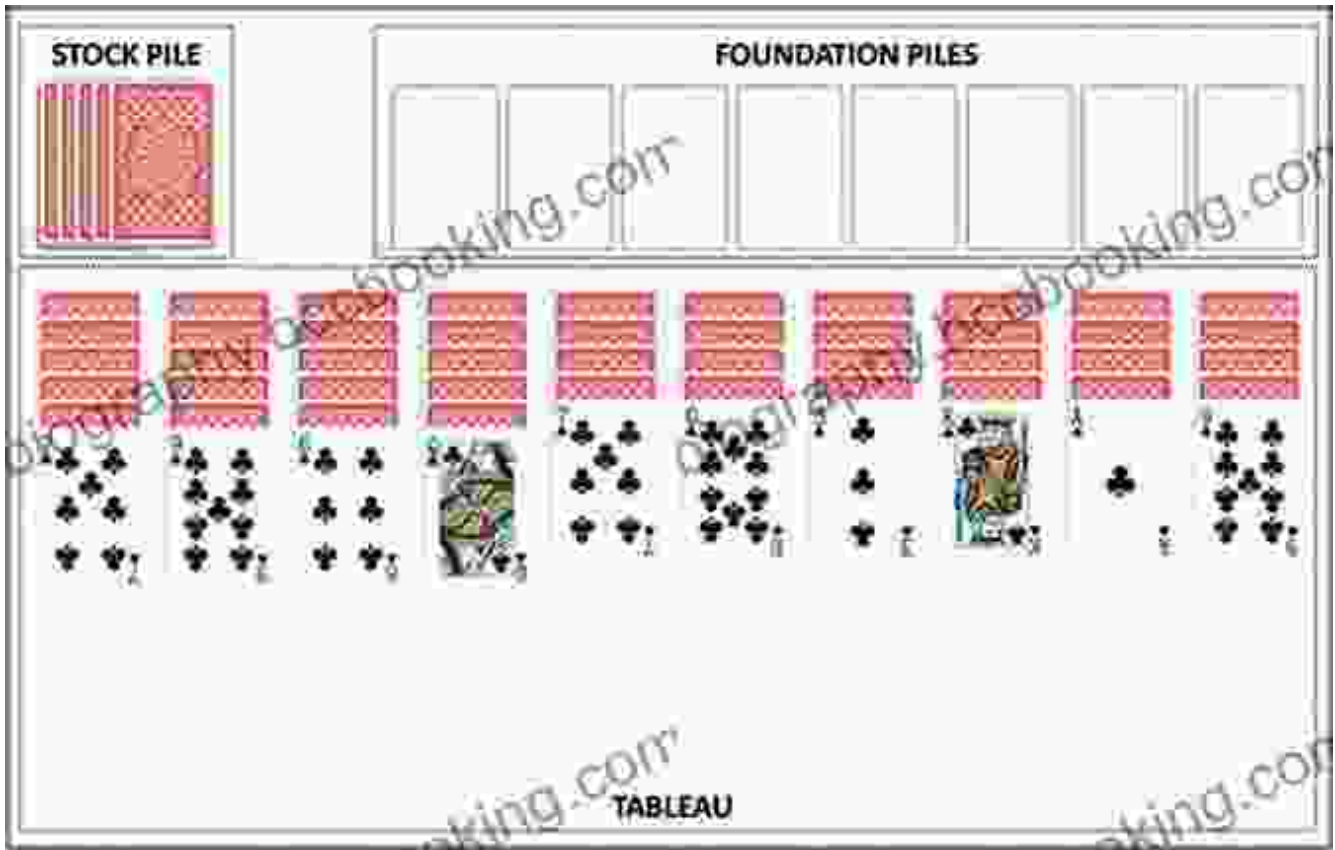

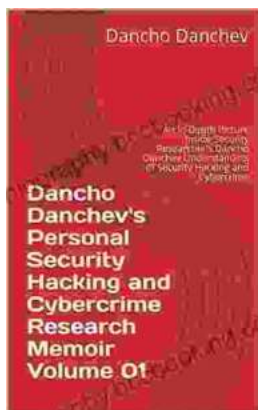
